
SAFEGUARDING QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Attendance

What does it mean if a child is persistently or severely absent?

Children who are registered at a school but regularly fail to turn up are officially referred to as being 'persistently' or 'severely' absent.


The school day is split into two sessions – one session counts as a morning or afternoon spent in school. Pupils who have missed more than 10% of school sessions are considered persistently absent, while children who have missed more than 50% of school sessions are referred to as severely absent.





Drinks in School

If your child has squash in school, it must be in a sealed bottle that is left on the lunch trolley and can not be taken into class. Your child is welcome to have a bottle filled with water in the class and this will be kept in a specific place.





Flu Vaccinations—Reception—Year 5

Please find attached to this week's Newsletter the information to register your child for their Flu Vaccination. This is a quick and painless nasal spray for most children and not an injection.

Only parents of Reception to Year 5 children need to do this.

This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu. All the information you need to consent to your child having their Flu Vaccination is in the letter.
