#### .Domestic Violence





Sadly, domestic abuse is not at all uncommon. Abuse can take many forms and include:

<u>Coercive control</u> (a pattern of intimidation, degradation, isolation and control with the use or threat of physical or sexual violence)

Psychological and/or emotional abuse.

Physical or sexual abuse.

Financial or economic abuse.

Harassment and stalking.

Online or digital abuse.

If you are reading this and it seems heartbreakingly familiar, reach out. Becoming an domestic abuse survivor starts with opening up and telling someone. Just ask for a cuppa with a member of staff you trust in school.

### **Online Safety**

With more than two billion active users, WhatsApp is the worlds most popular messaging service. Its end-to-end encryption only allows messages to be viewed by the sender and any recipients: not even WhatsApp itself can



read them. The UK's Online Safety Bill proposes to end such encryption on private messaging, but for the time being, this controversial feature remains. Please find attached the information sheet 'What Parents and Educators need to know about What's App'.

### **Arrangements for Next Year**

We are delighted to announce that from September we will be joined by three new members of staff.

Parents who have been here for some time, will know that over the years our school structure has often changed and flexed to best meet the needs of our children and there will be some movement this year.

Miss Mason, who is both a highly experienced teacher and a fully qualified SENDCO joins us. She has been an Assistant Headteacher in her previous school and will form the other half the of Senior Leadership Team, working alongside Mrs Bide. She will be teaching Year 3 and 4 children.

Mr Rainey, who has been teaching for seven years, holds a national qualification in leading teaching and has had previous experience teaching across KS2, joins us after moving back to Lincolnshire from out of the county. He will be teaching Year 5 and 6 children.

Mrs Crane will join Miss White in Class One. She has ten years of teaching experience in EYFS, Y1 and Y2. She has previously been a head of year in a large primary school and holds a master's degree in education. Miss White will return to her usual pattern of teaching 3 days each week, and Mrs Crane will teach the other two. They will be working closely alongside Mrs Brown (who holds a higher-level TA qualification) to teach EYFS, Y1 and Y2 children.

Mrs Burn will return to her normal working pattern and continue to lead the Thrive approach across the school, support interventions, individual and small group work.



#### **FAQs**

- Q. Why have you changed the structure of the classes?
- A. Because it is a low birth rate year, in common with other schools in the country, the number of children entering in EYFS in September has reduced. We have organised the structure in this way to give the children more equal sized classes and still have plenty of room to grow if more children move to the school as the new housing development in Osbournby completes.
- Q. What impact will this have on the curriculum?
- A. We are very used to mixed age classes here and planning for this is normal for us. This year, with support from the trust, we have trialled having EYFS on a totally separate curriculum to the year-one children. This has been very successful, so next year we will repeat that. The year one and two children will then move onto a two-year rolling curriculum which is how we organised the curriculum in the school prior to last year. Mrs Bide taught for many years here as the mixed year 1/2 teacher so Miss White and Mrs Crane will have her experience to draw upon.

Year 3 and 4 together will also follow a two-year roll, as will Year 5 and 6. Again, this has been normal for us for many years and is nothing new or different.

We are excited about the changes and are looking forward to benefiting from the range of expertise that our new staff will bring with them.

- Q. I'm worried about the change what should I do?
- A. Come and talk to us! Speak to Mrs Bide one morning or if you would prefer a longer sit-down chat, ring the school office and make an appointment.
- Q. Will it change again next year?
- A. One of the joys of small schools is that a few children can make a huge difference. If three families moved into the area, each with 3 children, it would be the equivalent of an extra year group joining the school! That makes it very difficult to predict how the structure will look from year to year. We organise the children in the way that is the best for them and makes best use of our resources. Any decision we do make is always carefully thought through, discussed with the trust and made with the best interests of the children at heart.
- Q. Who will take over the role of SENDCO?
- A. We are delighted to report that Miss Mason will be working closely with Mr Johnston before he departs to ensure a seamless transition into the role. Miss Mason has been SENDCO at her existing school for many years and is highly experienced in the role.

### Want your child to do well? Attendance Matters...

What counts as an exceptional circumstance?

School leaders are responsible for deciding what counts as an exceptional circumstance when it comes to a child missing school.

They should look at each application individually, considering the specific facts and background context. If a leave of absence is granted, the school will decide how long the pupil can be away from school.



Holidays are very rarely an acceptable reason for a school absence and are unlikely to be treated as an exceptional circumstance.

#### **PE Kit**

Please remember that **children should have their PE kit in school at all times.** 


