Team Around the Child (TAC)

If you are struggling at home, you are not on your own. Come into school and let us know. We might be able to offer you an Early Help Assessment to see if there any help available! Support can be accessed through a process called 'TAC'. See the attached leaflet that explains more. Lots of our families have been in TAC for a few weeks or months, got the help they have needed and now moved on. If you feel you need support, just let us know!

Want your child to do well? Attendance Matters...

How does attendance affect outcomes for pupils? Being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. Evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results.

The governments research found that pupils who performed better both at the end of primary and secondary school missed fewer days than those who didn't perform as well.

The data also shows that in 2019, primary school children in Key Stage 2 who didn't achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths missed on average four more days per school year than those whose performance exceeded the expected standard.

Similarly, in the same year, secondary school pupils who didn't achieve grade 9 to 4 in English and maths missed 10 more days on average over the key stage than those who achieved grade 9 to 5 in both English and maths.

The workshops are the perfect mix of Spectacular Science Experiments & Hands-on Activities, including:


- 'Magic' Tricks and Spectacular Experiments where the children's mouths will fall wide open with amazement! (And they'll learn about the scientific method too!)

Spotlight!




Each week we are going to try to share something that is happening in school that you might not know about.
