Safeguarding Question of the Week



Each week we will provide a question for you to ask your child to check their safeguarding knowledge and as a starting point for a discussion. This week the question is...

How do we stay safe in school?

PE Kit Checks

PE kits need to be in school **everyday**. This week we have carried out PE kit checks to make sure that everyone has the kit that they need in school. Learning to have the right equipment is a key life skill. Secondary schools have no-nonsense kit policies and when your child reaches the world of work, wearing appropriate clothing for their job will be essential. Learning for these important life lessons starts now, with understanding that they must have certain kit in school for PE.



Look out for a paper copy of the check that will have come home already or will have come home with your child tonight! If your child is missing any kit and you are struggling, please let us know. We have pre-loved kit at 50p per item for sale.

PE Kits should be brought in on a Monday and stay in school all week in lockers or on pegs. VERY occasionally your child may come home in their PE kit. If this is the case, we strongly suggest that you ask your child to take off their PE kit as soon as they get home, pop it back into their PE bag and leave it by the door ready to return to school the following day.

Forest School

Every class will have forest school on a Wednesday. We believe there is no such thing as bad weather—only inappropriate clothing! This means that we go out to Forest school every week (even when it is wet) so it is important that your child has warm clothes and a waterproof top layer in.

PLEASE, please make sure that all forest school kit, including waterproofs and wellies are named! It will need to come to school with your child every Wednesday morning and we will send it home every Wednesday evening. If at all possible, we strongly suggest leaving wellington boots in school to save carrying them in and out every week!

Flu Vaccinations—Reception—Year 5



The 11+ tests, for those Year 5 children who have signed up to take them, will be taking place in school on Friday 12th September (Verbal Reasoning) and Friday 19th September (Non-Verbal Reasoning). In preparation, the children will be completing practice tests issued by the grammar schools early next week.

Attendance

You may be aware that there is growing concern nationally that attendance figures have not returned to their pre-covid levels. Evidence shows that pupils who have good attendance enjoy better wellbeing and school performance than those who don't—so the concern is well founded.

In August 2024, the fine for school absences across the country was raised to £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days.

In the case of repeated fines, if a parent receives a second fine for the same child **within any three-year period**, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160.


Fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action like a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.

If you're prosecuted and attend court because your child hasn't been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500.

Money raised via fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.

SEPTEMBER CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH



As most of you will know, raising awareness of the symptoms of childhood cancer, and supporting children who are affected by cancer and their families are very important to us as a school family. This is a cause close to our heart as, very sadly, we lost James, a pupil at this school to childhood cancer. Whenever you see the Cheshire cat at school this is our way of remembering James and acknowledging that this is something he would have been involved with. As September is Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, we would like to take this opportunity to remind you all of the signs and symptoms to look out for.

Signs and symptoms of cancer in children

- Change in balance or speech
- Unexplained nausea or vomiting
 - Changes in behaviour
 - Unexplained seizures
 - Eye or vision changes
- Unexplained swelling or lump
- Unexplained bruising or rash
 - Headaches or fatigue

These are just some of the signs and symptoms.
